AN ACT TO ALLOW CERTAIN PUBLIC EMPLOYEES TO BE INDEMNIFIED FOR INJURIES RECEIVED WHILE IN OFFICIAL UNIFORM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 111F Chapter 41 General Laws as most recently
2 amended by Chapter 149 of the acts of 1964 is hereby further
3 amended by adding after the word town or a firefighter who is
4 wearing his official uniform in reporting to duty or going off duty is
5 so incapacitated because of injuries so sustained he shall be granted
6 leave without loss of pay for the period of such incapacity.
