## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE STATE BOARD OF RETIREMENT TO INCREASE THE PENSION ALLOWANCE OF FRANCIS W. MORAN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary and to  
2 correct an inequity in the pension allowance of Francis W. Moran  
3 of East Boston, a retired employee of the department of public  
4 works, the state board of retirement is hereby authorized and  
5 directed to increase the pension allowance of said Francis W.  
6 Moran by an amount not to exceed nine hundred and sixty dollars  
7 per year, retroactive to July first, nineteen hundred and seventy-  
8 six.

By the Clerk of the House, the bill, printed by the House of Representatives, is hereby distributed to the members of the House of Representatives, and the bill is hereby referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, to report thereon at the next meeting of the House of Representatives.

**THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES**

Article I. Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted into or excluded from this Union, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, including those bound to Service for a Year or more, excluding Indians not taxed, three fifths of all other Persons.
