

HOUSE No. 5532

By Mr. Nickinello of Natick, petition of Louis R. Nickinello that the town of Natick be authorized to use a certain parcel of state land located in the town of Dover for the construction of wells and authorizing the conection thereof to the water system of said town of Natick. State Administration.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF NATICK TO USE A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF WELLS AND AUTHORIZING THE CONNECTION THEREOF TO THE WATER SYSTEM THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of constructing and maintaining
2 a system of wells for the water supply of the town of Natick. Said
3 Town is hereby authorized to use a portion of land located in the
4 town of Dover formally owned by Stigmatine Fathers Inc. and
5 presently owned by the commonwealth of Massachusetts depart-
6 ment of education.

1 SECTION 2. For the purpose of constructing and maintaining
2 water mains to connect said wells to the water system of the town of
3 Natick.

4 Said Town is hereby authorized to use a fifty foot wide strip of
5 land under the jurisdiction of the commonwealth of Massachusetts
6 department of education in the town of Dover and the town of
7 Wellesley, and land in the existing sixty foot width right of way in
8 Washington street in the town of Wellesley bounded and described
9 as follows: —

10 Beginning on the southerly side of the Charles River on property

11 owned by the Commonwealth in the town of Dover and running
12 within said land to a bridge crossing the Charles River on land
13 formally owned by the Stigmatine Fathers Inc. as shown on a plan
14 recorded in Norfolk Registry of Deeds in Plan Book #2288 Plan
15 416:

16 Thence north $64^{\circ} 54$ minutes west a distance of 100 feet more or
17 less crossing the Charles River and crossing the town boundary
18 separating the Town of Dover and Wellesley said boundary being
19 at the approximate center line of the Charles River, to a point:

20 Thence North $26^{\circ} 23$ minutes west a distance of 418.32 feet more
21 or less to a point on the easterly side line of Washington Stret in the
22 Town of Wellesley:

23 Thence South $51^{\circ} 54$ minutes, 40 seconds west a distance of 305
24 feet more or less on Washington Street in the town of Wellesley to
25 the town boundary separating the towns of Wellesley and Natick.
