The committee on Government Regulations, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2164) of Leon J. Lombardi, Argeo P. Cellucci and Stephen J. Karol that persons who hold licenses as barbers and hairdressers be authorized to work together in the same establishment; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3094) of Genivive Glennon and William R. Keating relative to imposing additional licensing requirements for persons practicing massage, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5951) ought to be adopted.

Ordered, That the committee on government regulations be authorized to sit during the recess of the general court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject matter of current house documents numbered: 2164, legislation permitting persons who hold licenses as barbers and hairdressers to work together in the same establishment; and 3094, legislation imposing additional licensing requirements for persons practicing massage.

Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the state house or elsewhere, may hold public hearings, may travel within the commonwealth and may expend for clerical and other services and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said committee shall report to the general court the results of its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or before the first Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and seventy-nine.
