AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE OF OFFICE FOR KENNETH C. GRIME, INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICES OF TOWN TREASURER AND TAX COLLECTOR IN THE TOWN OF SOMERSET.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or
2 special law to the contrary, the tenure of office of Kenneth C.
3 Grime, incumbent of the offices of town treasurer and tax collector
4 in the town of Somerset, shall be unlimited, unless incapacitated by
5 physical or mental disability from performing the duties thereof,
6 but he may be removed for cause after a hearing conducted by the
7 board of selectmen of said town in the manner provided by section
8 forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for acceptance to the
2 voters of the town of Somerset at the annual town meeting in the
3 year nineteen hundred and eighty in the form of the following
4 question, which shall be placed on the official ballot to be used for
5 the election of town officers at said meeting: — "Shall an act passed
6 by the General Court in the year nineteen hundred and seventy-
7 nine entitled 'An Act providing tenure of office for Kenneth C.
8 Grime incumbent of the offices town treasurer and tax collector in
9 the town of Somerset', be accepted?". If a majority of the votes cast
10 in answer to said question is in the affirmative, this act shall take
11 effect but not otherwise.
