## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Nine.

AN ACT PROHIBITING THE DISPLAY OF THE WORDS "POLICE" OR "EMER-GENCY" ON MOTOR VEHICLES USED BY PERSONS ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF PRIVATE DETECTIVES, AND INVESTIGATORS AND WATCH, GUARD OR PATROL AGENCIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 29 of chapter 147 of the General Laws, as amended by
- 2 chapter 42 of the acts of 1970, is hereby further amended by
- 3 inserting after the first paragraph the following paragraph:
- No motor vehicle used in the business of a license shall have displayed therein or thereon the words "police" or "emergency",
- 6 and no such motor vehicle shall be deemed to be a special purpose
- 7 motor vehicle assigned to emergency disaster services under the
- 8 provisions of section seven I of chapter ninety.
