## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

### AN ACT DEFINING THE MINIMUM PER DIEM COMPENSATION FOR TEMPORARY SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 40 of Chapter 71 is amended by adding after para-
- 2 graph one the following paragraph: —
- 3 “The per diem minimum compensation of temporary sub-
- 4 stitute teachers, as defined in Chapter 71, section 38b, shall
- 5 be one-one hundred and eightieth ( $1/180$ ) of the salary of a
- 6 teacher with a bachelor's degree on the first step of the sched-
- 7 ule utilized by the employer school committee.
