AN ACT RELATIVE TO EDUCATIONAL COLLABORATIVES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sixth paragraph of section 4E of chapter 40
2 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 2
3 of chapter 481 of the acts of 1978, is hereby further amended
4 by adding at the end the following sentence: — No person
5 shall be eligible for employment by said collaborative board
6 as an instructor of children with severe special needs, teacher
7 of children with special needs, teacher, guidance counselor or
8 school psychologist unless such person has been granted a cer-
9 tificate by the board of education under the provisions of
10 section thirty-eight G of chapter seventy-one or section six of
11 chapter seventy-one A or an approval under the regulations
12 promulgated by the board of education under chapter seventy-
13 one B or chapter seventy-four with respect to the type of posi-
14 tion for which he seeks employment; provided, however, that
15 nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent the
16 collaborative board from employing persons to serve in posi-
17 tions other than those named above.

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section one
2 of this act, any person employed by an educational collabora-
3 tive board as an instructor of children with severe special
4 needs, teacher of children with special needs, teacher, guid-
5 ance counselor or school psychologist on the effective date of
6 this act shall be exempted from the provisions of said section
7 one so long as he continues to serve in the same position.
