AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Clause 1 of section 5 of chapter 111B of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by inserting at the end
3 thereof the following: — provided further, that the funds so
4 received from any billings mechanisms shall stay within the
5 community program for the purposes of off-setting true pro-
6 gram costs, and for the expansion of services as shall be
7 deemed necessary and advisable by the Division of Alcohol
8 and the community provider.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 5 of said chapter 111B is hereby
2 further amended by inserting after the first paragraph the
3 following paragraph: —

4 Any public detoxification program shall bill for services
5 rendered to any alcoholic health consumer in need of detoxi-
6 fication services.

1 SECTION 3. Said chapter 111B is hereby further amended
2 by inserting after section 5 the following section: —

3 *Section 5A.* All alcohol out-patient services, funded or con-
4 tracted by the Division of Alcohol, Department of Public
5 Health shall be licensed by that division as out-patient centers
6 for the express purpose of these free-standing centers being
7 allowed to bill all private or public third party carriers with
8 the funds so received staying within the community program
9 for the purposes of off-setting true program costs, and for
10 the expansion of services as shall be deemed necessary and ad-
11 visable by the Division of Alcohol and the community pro-
12 vider.
