AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE USE OF CRIMINAL FILES BY CERTAIN  
AUTHORITIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The fourth paragraph of section 100A of chap-  
2 ter 276 of the General Laws, as appearing in chapter 525 of  
3 the acts of 1974, is hereby amended by adding the following  
4 words: — and in issuing licenses for the sale of alcoholic  
5 beverages or for the use of entertainment.

1 SECTION 2. Section 172 of chapter 6 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph, as appear-  
3 ing in section 1 of chapter 805 of the acts of 1972, and in-  
4 serting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 Criminal offender record information shall be disseminated  
6 whether directly or through any intermediary, only to (a)  
7 criminal justice agencies; (b) duly established and authorized  
8 recruiting personnel of the armed forces of the United States  
9 as defined in Title 10 section 101 of the United States Code  
10 and the active or organized militia of the Commonwealth as  
11 defined in section 4 of chapter thirty-three; and (c) such other  
12 individuals and agencies as are authorized access to such rec-  
13 ords by statute.

14 Notwithstanding the provisions of this section or those of  
15 General Laws chapter 66A, the following shall be public  
16 records: (1) original records of entry such as police blotters  
17 maintained by criminal justice agencies compiled chronologi-  
18 cally; (2) court records of public judicial proceedings; (3) pub-

19 lished court or administrative proceedings or public judicial  
 20 administrative or legislative proceedings; and (4) records of  
 21 traffic offenses maintained by the Registry of Motor Vehicles  
 22 for the purpose of regulating the issuance, supervision, revo-  
 23 cation of drivers', pilots' or other operators' licenses.

1 SECTION 3. Section 4 of chapter 33 of the General Laws, as  
 2 amended by chapter 408 of the acts of 1963, is hereby further  
 3 amended by inserting after the word "enlisted" in line 6, the  
 4 words: — or civilian.
