AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PUNISHMENT OF JUVENILE OFFENDERS  
ADJUDICATED DELINQUENT BY REASON OF THE THEFT OF A MOTOR  
VEHICLE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General  
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 58B of chapter 119 of the General Law, as most  
2 recently amended by section 16 of chapter 838 of the acts of  
3 1969, is hereby further amended by inserting after the first  
4 sentence the following sentence: — If the child is adjudged  
5 delinquent by reason of having stolen a motor vehicle, the  
6 court shall place such child on probation for a period of at  
7 least one year, and if the child is adjudged delinquent a second  
8 or subsequent time for the same reason, the court shall com-  
9 mit such child to the department for a period of at least three  
10 months.
