SENATE No. 1390

By Mr. McKinnon, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1390) of Allan R. McKinnon for legislation to authorize that certain years of service by Francis A. Thibodeau to the county of Norfolk be credited for pension purposes in computing his retirement allowance. Public Service.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THAT CERTAIN YEARS OF SERVICE BY FRANCIS A. THIBODEAU TO THE COUNTY OF NORFOLK BE CREDITED FOR PENSION PURPOSES IN COMPUTING HIS RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary,
2 the Norfolk County Retirement Board is hereby authorized
3 and directed to credit the term of service of Francis A.
4 Thibodeau as a commitment officer in said county from 1953
5 to 1961, for pension purposes in computing his retirement
6 allowance; provided, however, he contributes the appropriate
7 share of employee pension obligations for this period of serv-
8 ice, subject to the determination of the Norfolk County Re-
9 tirement Board and in accordance with the provisions of
10 chapter 32 of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage and
2 shall apply retroactively from the date of his retirement.

The Constitution of the United States

to the President, Vice-President, and Judges

THE PRESIDENT shall have the same powers and authority as are vested in the President of the United States by the Constitution and the laws of the United States.

He shall hold his office for four years, and shall be eligible for re-election to that office for one term only.

He shall be commander in chief of the Army and Navy of the United States, and of the Militia of the United States.

He shall have the power to grant reprieves and pardons for offenses against the United States, except in cases of impeachment.

He shall have the power to make treaties, provided he consult with the Senate.

He shall have the power to nominate and to receive, and to commission, judges of the Supreme and inferior Courts, and all other officers and judges of the United States.

He shall have the power to grant commissions and to receive oaths of office.

He shall have the power to grant pardons and to receive oaths of office.
