AN ACT CLARIFYING THE NEGOTIABILITY OF CERTAIN INSURANCE  
BENEFIT PROGRAMS IN COLLECTIVE BARGAINING CONTRACTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 150E of the General Laws as enacted by Chapter
- 2 1078 of the Acts of 1973 is hereby amended by adding after
- 3 Section 7 the following: —
- 4 The parties to a collective bargaining agreement authorized
- 5 by this Chapter may negotiate and implement benefit pro-
- 6 grams supplementing and adding to the insurance benefits
- 7 provided to public employees by Chapters 32 and 32B, not-
- 8 withstanding any limiting provisions of those Chapters.
