AN ACT PROHIBITING PUBLIC OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES FROM BEING PAID FOR EXPENSES INCURRED BECAUSE OF THE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:
