In Town Meeting, February 26, 1980

This will certify that at a Special Town Meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of West Boylston on February 25, 1980 the following action was taken: —

VOTED: To petition, through the Selectmen, the General Court to enact a special law substantially as follows: —

An Act exempting the office of Chief of Police in the Town of West Boylston from the Civil Service law and rules: —

Section 1. The office of Chief of Police in the Town of West Boylston shall be exempt from the Civil Service law and rules as approved by General Laws Chapter 31, Section 48, notwithstanding the previous vote of the Town on April 3, 1978 to include such office in the classified Civil Service.

Section 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT EXEMPTING THE OFFICE OF CHIEF OF POLICE IN THE TOWN OF WEST BOYLSTON FROM THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW AND RULES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The office of Chief of Police in the Town of West
2 Boylston shall be exempt from the Civil Service law and rules
3 as approved by General Laws Chapter 31, Section 48, notwith-
4 standing the previous vote of the Town on April 3, 1978 to
5 include such office in the classified Civil Service.

1 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.
