AN ACT RELATIVE TO PROVIDING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE REMOVAL OF THE SOURCES OF LEAD POISONING IN RESIDENTIAL PREMISES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 194 of chapter 111 of the General Laws, inserted  
2 by section 1 of chapter 1081 of the acts of 1971, is hereby  
3 amended by inserting in line one after the word "detection"  
4 the following words: —

5 and removal pursuant to the provisions of section one  
6 hundred ninety-seven of this chapter

7 and further amended by inserting after the last paragraph  
8 the following paragraph: —

9 Such program of removal shall consist of grants and loans  
10 to qualified owners of dwellings in which the paint, plaster  
11 or other accessible substance contains dangerous amounts of  
12 lead for the purpose of financing the cost of removing such  
13 paint, plaster or other substance.
