**AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR SPEEDY HEARINGS IN THE BOSTON
HOUSING COURT.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives In General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general law to the
2 contrary, a hearing shall be held on any summary process ac-
3 tion for non-payment of rent within ten days of the application
4 therefor in the Boston Housing Court. If such hearing is not
5 held, the tenant shall be deemed to be evicted and execution
6 shall issue forthwith.

The University of Massachusetts

In the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two

And for the purpose hereinafter mentioned in this Statute
 Enacted, that

The University of Massachusetts shall have the power to receive and hold any sum of money or other property which may be given or bequeathed to it by any person, and to use the same for the purposes of the said University.

And in relation to the provisions of any general law to the effect that a person shall be held to be sane during his life, it shall be the duty of the said University to cause to be made a report to the Board of Trustees of the said University, in such form as the Board of Trustees shall determine, of the mental condition of every person who shall be held to be sane during his life, and of the reasons therefor, and to cause the same to be printed and distributed to the Board of Trustees of the said University.
