AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE UNAUTHORIZED USE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Paragraph (a) of subdivision (2) of section 24 of Chapter 90
- 2 is hereby amended by adding after the first sentence the follow-
- 3 ing sentences;
- 4 Any person who damages a motor vehicle that is used
- 5 without authority is liable for such damage to said vehicle,
- 6 and if said person is a minor, the parents or guardian of said
- 7 minor are liable as far as is allowable by law. Whosoever shall
- 8 be convicted of a second or subsequent offense of unauthor-
- 9 ized use of a motor vehicle shall be punished by a mandatory
- 10 sentence of not less than six months in a house of correction
- 11 or State prison, or, in the case of a minor, such other in-
- 12 carceration as the judge may **direct**.

- 5 without liability to him for such damage to said water
- 6 and if said person is a minor the parents or guardian of said
- 7 minor are liable as far as is allowable by law. Wherever shall
