**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Six.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING EXEMPTIONS FROM ATTACHMENT,  
EXECUTION AND SUPPLEMENTARY PROCESS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 34 of Chapter 235 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out clause "Fourteenth," as amended by  
3 section 6 of Chapter 501 of the Acts of 1975, and inserting in  
4 place thereof the following: —

5 Fourteenth, One home or dwelling in which the debtor re-  
6 sides at the time of issuance of the execution, together with  
7 the land on which the home or dwelling is located; estates of  
8 homestead as defined in Chapter one hundred and eighty-eight  
9 (188); or, in lieu thereof, the amount of money each rental  
10 period, not exceeding two hundred dollars per month, neces-  
11 sary to pay the rent for the dwelling occupied by the debtor.

### The Government of the District of Columbia

In the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Six

AN ACT TO AMEND THE SEVERAL SECTIONS OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA ACTS RELATIVE TO THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA AND TO REPEAL CERTAIN SECTIONS OF SAID ACTS.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, on the twenty-third day of August, A. D. 1926.

SECTION 1. That section 56 of Chapter 25 of the District Code is hereby amended by striking out clause "fourth", as amended by section 5 of Chapter 501 of the acts of 1925, and inserting in place thereof the following:—

4. Fourteenth. One house or dwelling in which the district is held at the time of seizure of the dwelling together with the land on which the same or dwelling is located, either of which is described in Chapter one hundred and eighty-eight as defined in Chapter one hundred and eighty-eight, or, in lieu thereof, the amount of money each year in excess of two hundred dollars per month, more or less, to pay the rent for the dwelling occupied by the owner.
