AN ACT TO DEFINE DUTIES OF SUPERVISORS AND ASSISTANT SUPERVISOR OF PROBATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR NEEDED ADDITIONAL PERSONNEL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 276, Section 99C is hereby amended by striking out
2 the first paragraph and replacing it with the following lan-
3 guage: —

4 The Commissioner of Probation shall appoint four Super-
5 visors of Court Probation Services and one Assistant Super-
6 visor of Court Probation Services. The Supervisors of Court
7 Probation Services shall be paid by the Commonwealth the
8 salary established in Group 11 of the salary schedule for Pro-
9 bation Officers set forth in Section Ninety-Nine B. The As-
10 sistant Supervisor of Court Probation Services shall be paid
11 by the Commonwealth the salary established in Group 10 of
12 the salary schedule for Probation Officers as set forth in Sec-
13 tion Ninety-Nine B. Said position shall not be subject to
14 Chapter Thirty-one. Said supervisors and Assistant Super-
15 visor of Court Probation Services shall, in addition to other
16 duties imposed upon them by said Commissioner, be respon-
17 sible for the evaluation of the Probation Services in each court
18 in the Commonwealth, for the recruitment, training, educa-
19 tional development and evaluation of the work performance
20 of Probation Officers. They shall plan, initiate and develop
21 volunteer, diversion and other programs in consultation with
22 Probation Officers throughout the Commonwealth and shall
23 supervise and evaluate all programs within the Probation
24 Service.
