The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Eight.

AN ACT PLACING THE SERGEANT-AT-ARMS OF THE GENERAL COURT OF THE COMMONWEALTH IN GROUP 4 OF THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (g) of subdivision 2 of section 3 of chapter 32 of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the definition of
3 Group 4, as most recently amended by section 85 of chapter 706 of
4 the acts of 1975, and inserting in place thereof the following
5 definition:—

6 *Group 4.*— Division of law enforcement, office of the secretary
7 of the executive office of environmental affairs; officials and
8 employees of the registry of motor vehicles appointed by the
9 registrar under section twenty-nine of chapter ninety; capitol
10 police; members of the state police detectives appointed under
11 section six of chapter twenty-two, serving in any division of the
12 department of public safety; members of the police force of the
13 metropolitan district commission; employees of the Massachusetts
14 Port Authority at the General Edward Lawrence Logan Inter-
15 national Airport, comprising permanent crash crewmen, fire
16 control men, assistant fire control men; members of police and fire
17 departments not classified in *Group 1*; any police officer of the
18 Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority; employees whose
19 regular compensation is paid by the United States from funds
20 allocated to the Massachusetts National Guard and who are
21 regularly and permanently employed under the control of the

22 military department of the commonwealth and whose duties in
23 such employment require substantially all normal working hours
24 and whose continued employment is based upon federal
25 recognition in the Massachusetts National Guard; employees of a
26 municipal gas or electric generating or distribution plant who are
27 employed as linemen, electric switchboard operators, electric
28 maintenance men, steam engineers, boiler operators, firemen,
29 oilers, mechanical maintenance men, and supervisors of said
30 employees; employees of the department of correction who are
31 employed at any correctional institution or prison camp under the
32 control of said department and who hold the position of
33 correction officer, female correction officer, industrial instructor,
34 recreation officer, assistant industrial shop manager, industrial
35 shop manager, assistant to the supervisor of industries, supervisor
36 of industries, senior correction officer, senior female correction
37 officer, supervising correction officer, supervising female correc-
38 tion officer, prison camp officer, senior prison camp officer,
39 supervising prison camp officer, assistant deputy superintendent
40 or supervising identification agent; employees who hold the
41 position of state hospital steward in the department of correction;
42 the sheriff, master, deputy master, assistant deputy master and
43 correction officers of county correctional facilities; the chief fire
44 warden and district fire wardens in the executive office of environ-
45 mental affairs; and the sergeant-at-arms of the General Court.
