AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF SPECIAL POLICE OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The selectmen of a town may appoint special
2 police officers and grant to them, at their discretion, the power to
3 arrest and detain any person violating any law within the
4 jurisdiction of the town.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by
2 the voters of the town at an annual or special town meeting.

APPROVED BY THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

SECTION 1. The objects of a joint stock company shall be limited to the objects specified in the charter of the company, and the company shall not be authorized to do any other business than that specified in the charter of the company.

SECTION 2. The directors of a joint stock company shall be elected by the shareholders of the company, and shall hold office for such period as may be determined by the company.
