AN ACT PROVIDING FOR EQUAL EMPLOYMENT RIGHT FOR WOMEN AS POLICE OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
- 2 after section 20D the following section:—
- 3 *Section 20E.* The employment of or promotion as a police
- 4 officer under the provisions of this chapter shall be from a
- 5 certification of persons eligible for appointment or promotion
- 6 without regard or consideration of the sex of such person.
