AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF MARLBOROUGH TO TRANSFER CERTAIN FUNDS TO ITS RESERVE FOR ANTICIPATED TRANSFER ACCOUNT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of section twenty and section
2 sixty-three of chapter forty-four of the General Laws, the city of
3 Marlborough may appropriate sums not exceeding two hundred
4 sixty-two thousand five hundred ninety-two dollars in the
5 aggregate, from the proceeds of loans issued; (1) August fifteenth,
6 nineteen hundred and seventy-four, for the purchase of land for a
7 skating rink; (2) August fifteenth, nineteen hundred and seventy-
8 four, for the purpose of purchasing land for a new high school; (3)
9 July twenty-ninth, nineteen hundred and sixty-six proceeds from
10 land taking by Massachusetts Electric; (4) March thirty-first,
11 nineteen hundred and sixty-six, proceeds from land taking by the
12 commonwealth; (5) proceeds from sale of various parcels of land
13 by the city of Marlborough, sold on various dates over the years;
14 (6) anticipated proceeds from the sale of the old junior high school
15 building in the not too distant future; which proceeds are not
16 presently necessary for the purposes specified in the authorization
17 of said loans and sale of city property, to reserve for anticipated
18 transfer account.
