HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, April 18, 1978.

The House committee on Ways and Means, to whom were referred the Resolve providing for an investigation and study by the Department of Environmental Management, in conjunction with other affected agencies such as the Metropolitan District Commission, relative to the positions with the job title lifeguard and head lifeguard (House, No. 64); the Bill amending the motorized bicycle law (House, No. 221, changed); the Bill further regulating the collection and transmission of health care resources data (House, No. 1996); the Bill authorizing temporary shelter care centers for children to admit adults who accompany such children (House, No. 2010); the Bill directing the secretary of Human Services to establish an information office for the channeling of inquiries in the human services are (House, No. 2567); the Bill providing that the Commonwealth reimburse certain cities and towns for fifty per cent of expenditures for the development of increased reservoir capacity (House, No. 2629); the Bill authorizing and directing the secretary of Environmental Affairs to control the growth of weeds and pollution in Lake Noquochoke in the town of Dartmouth (House, No. 2630); the Bill authorizing the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Management to lease a portion of Wompatuck State park for the development and operation of a skeet and trap range (House, No. 2631); the Bill exempting certain medically necessary items from the sales and use tax, so called (House, No. 2861); the Bill amending the health and educational facilities act (House, No. 3689); the Bill authorizing the public access board to construct a boat ramp in Everett (House, No. 4486); the Bill granting native Americans indigenous to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts fishing, hunting and trapping rights in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts at no cost (House, No. 5243); the Bill relative to the cost of care provided in state mental hospitals and other facilities (House, No. 5288); the Bill requiring the commissioner of Public Health to publish consumer guides for services available for physically, emotionally or mentally handicapped persons (House, No. 5290); the

Bill providing for emergency assistance for needy families with children to assure living arrangements in a home (House, No. 5316); the Bill to authorize the charges for the issuance of permits to major air pollution sources, as required by the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1977 (House, No. 5377); the Bill recodifying the Commonwealth's forest cutting practices laws (House, No. 5378); the Bill directing certain cities and towns to prepare a list of public rights of way leading to the shore line, common landing places, shore reservations and rights of way to great ponds (House, No. 5394); the Bill providing for the cleaning and dredging of the harbor of the town of Winthrop to improve boating and eliminate pollution (House, No. 5395); the Bill directing the department of Environmental Quality Engineering to dredge certain waterways in the town of Braintree (House, No. 5396); the Petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2002) of Francis D. Doris for legislation to establish the rate of payment for medical services paid to the Annemark Nursing Home, Inc., in the city of Revere; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2079) of Francis Doris and another for legislation to establish an aeronautical bureau within the Division of State police; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2726) of John P. Cusack, William Stanley, Samuel Rotondi and John G. King that courses in driver education include comprehensive instruction in the dangers of driving under the influence of alcohol and/or controlled substance; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3624) of John A. Businger that the department of Community Affairs be authorized to expend a certain sum of money for contracts entered into by said department with certain housing authorities; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4867) of Melvin H. King for legislation to establish a commission on inner city youths; report, recommending that the accompanying Order (House, No. 5529) ought to be adopted.
