The committee on Urban Affairs, to whom was recommitted the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4970) of Thomas F. Fallon that electricity generated by the Metropolitan District Commission at Wachusett Reservoir be made available to the inhabitants of the town of Clinton and surrounding towns at reduced rates, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1319) of the Board of Directors of the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority and Lincoln P. Cole, Jr., that the Metropolitan District Commission be directed to convey certain parcels of land and easements in the city of Cambridge and in the town of Arlington to said authority, reports recommending that the accompanying resolve (House, No. 5964) ought to pass.

RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION
ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO
DETERMINING THE WATER SUPPLY OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That the special commission, established by chapter
2 thirteen of the resolves of nineteen hundred and seventy-seven,
3 shall in the course of its investigation and study, consider the
4 subject matter proposed by current house document number 1319,
5 relative to authorizing and directing the metropolitan district
6 commission to convey certain parcels of land and easements in the
7 city of Cambridge and the town of Arlington and more specifically
8 referred to as the Alewife area to the massachusetts bay
9 transportation authority; 4970, relative to providing that electrici-
10 ty operated by the metropolitan district commission at wachusett
11 reservoir be made available to the inhabitants of the town of
12 Clinton and contiguous towns.
