

By Mr. Lussier of Pittsfield, petition of Thomas R. Lussier that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be authorized to provide special registration plates for motor vehicles owned by members of the National Guard. Public Safety.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATES FOR MOTOR VEHICLES OWNED BY MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL GUARD OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The sixth paragraph of section 2 of chapter 90 of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the first sentence the
3 following two sentences: The registrar shall, without registration
4 fee, furnish to the owner of a private passenger vehicle who is an
5 enlisted person or officer of the Massachusetts National Guard,
6 Army or Air, or an officer of the State Staff under section 15 of
7 chapter 33, upon application by such enlisted person or officer, on
8 a form prescribed by the registrar, two plates bearing the inscrip-
9 tion "National Guard" and displaying a register number assigned
10 by the registrar. Any enlisted person or officer who has been
11 furnished such registration plates shall no later than ten days prior
12 to his discharge or retirement from the military forces of the
13 commonwealth, surrender such plates to the registrar and shall be
14 eligible to receive, at normal fee, such other non-distinctive plates
15 as the registrar may furnish under the provisions of this chapter for
16 the balance, if any, of such registration period.
