**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Two.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Paragraph (g) of subdivision (2) of section 3 of chapter 32 of the  
2 General Laws is hereby amended in the definition of Group 4, as  
3 most recently amended by chapter 706 of the acts of 1975, by  
4 striking out said paragraph and inserting in place thereof the  
5 following new paragraph: —

6 Group 4 — Division of law enforcement, office of the secretary  
7 of the executive office of environmental affairs; officials and em-  
8 ployees of the registry of motor vehicles appointed by the registrar  
9 under section twenty-nine of chapter ninety; superintendent of  
10 state office buildings; capitol police; members of the state police  
11 detectives appointed under section six of chapter twenty-two, serv-  
12 ing in any division of the department of public safety; members of  
13 the police force of the metropolitan district commission; em-  
14 ployees of the Massachusetts Port Authority at the General Ed-  
15 ward Lawrence Logan International Airport, comprising perman-  
16 ent crash crewmen, fire control men, assistant fire controlmen;  
17 members of police and fire departments not classified in Group 1;  
18 any police officer of the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Au-  
19 thority; employees whose regular compensation is paid by the  
20 United States from funds allocated to the Massachusetts National  
21 Guard and who are regularly and permanently employed under the  
22 control of the military department of the commonwealth and  
23 whose duties in which employment require substantially all normal

24 working hours and whose continued employment is based upon  
25 federal recognition in the Massachusetts National Guard; em-  
26 ployees of a municipal gas or electric generating or distribution  
27 plant who are employed as linemen, electric switchboard opera-  
28 tors, electric maintenance men, steam enegineers, boiler operators,  
29 firemen, oilers, mechanical maintenance men, and supervisors of  
30 said employees; employees of the department of correction who are  
31 employed at any correctional institution or prison camp under the  
32 control of said department and who hold the position of correction  
33 officer, female correction officer, industrial instructor, recreation  
34 officer, assistant industrial shop manager, industrial shop manag-  
35 er, assistant to the supervisor of industries, supervisor of indus-  
36 tries, senior correction officer, senior female correction officer,  
37 supervising correction officer, supervising female correction offi-  
38 cer, prison camp officer, senior prison camp officer, supervising  
39 prison camp officer, assistant deputy superintendent, chief of se-  
40 curity for the University of Massachusetts medical school or super-  
41 vising identification agent; employees who hold the position of  
42 state hospital steward in the department of correction; the sheriff,  
43 superintendent, assistant superintendent, assistant deputy superin-  
44 tendent and correction officers of county correctional facilities;  
45 and the chief fire warden and district fire wardens in the executive  
46 office of environmental affairs.
