AN ACT REQUIRING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A FEE FOR SERVICE PLAN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any special or general law to the contrary, the
2 Secretaries of the Executive Offices of Human Services, and Elder
3 Affairs are hereby authorized and directed to develop a uniform
4 plan for fees to be paid by the person, family or legally responsible
5 relative or guardian of the individual receiving services provided
6 or purchased by the Commonwealth; provided, however, that no
7 fee shall be charged for services where in the opinion of said
8 secretaries a fee would significantly prevent accomplishing the
9 purpose of the service or is administratively unfeasible; and pro-
10 vided further that said secretaries shall report said plan to the
11 Legislature on or before January 1, 1981.
