AN ACT RELATIVE TO ELIGIBILITY FOR BENEFITS UNDER THE VICTIM OF A VIOLENT CRIME.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 3 of Chapter 258H, as added by Chap-
2 ter 852 of the Acts of 1968, is hereby amended by adding at the end
3 thereof the following: —

4 Except in the case where one spouse commits a violent crime
5 against the other spouse the surviving children of the offender may
6 be eligible for compensation.

1 SECTION 2. Section 5 of Chapter 258A, as added by Chapter
2 852 of the Acts of 1968, is hereby amended by adding at the end
3 thereof the following: —

4 In the case where the victim is survived by minor children, said
5 children and or gaurdian may be eligible for compensation for any
6 initial expenses incurred with caring for the children immediately
7 after the crime.
