AN ACT PROVIDING THAT STATE, METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION, AND CAPITOL POLICE, AND REGISTRY INSPECTORS SHALL BE PAID A SALARY COMMENSURATE WITH SALARIES PAID TO POLICE IN THE CITIES OF BOSTON, CAMBRIDGE, AND QUINCY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the
- 2 state police, metropolitan district commission police and capitol
- 3 police, and registry inspectors shall be paid a salary commensurate
- 4 with salaries paid to police in the cities of Boston, Cambridge and
- 5 Quincy.
