AN ACT RELATIVE TO PUBLIC HIGHER EDUCATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of Chapter 15A of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking the word "fifteen" in the first sentence,
3 and substituting the word "seventeen".

1 SECTION 2. Section 2 of Chapter 15A of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by adding to the second paragraph the following
3 new language: — "Provided further that two members shall be
4 appointed who are members of AFL-CIO labor organizations."

1 SECTION 3. Section 2 of Chapter 15A of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking the word "eight" in the seventh para-
3 graph and substituting the word "nine".

1 SECTION 4. Section 5 of Chapter 15A of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by adding the following new language: —
3 (aa) The board shall appoint a member of an AFL-CIO organi-
4 zation to all task forces, commissions, etc. which the board feels are
5 necessary to be established.

1 SECTION 5. Section 9 of Chapter 15A of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking the word "eight" in the first sentence
3 and substituting the word "nine".

1 SECTION 6. Section 9 of Chapter 15A of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by adding to the second paragraph the following
3 new language: — “Provided further that one member shall be
4 appointed who is a member of an AFL-CIO labor organization.”.
