AN ACT RELATING TO CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF HOUSING AUTHORITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 29 of chapter 121B is amended by striking the fifth
2 paragraph thereof and by inserting in its place the following:

3 No employee of any Housing Authority, except an employee
4 occupying any of the positions of Executive Director or Adminis-
5 trator, Deputy or Assistant Executive Director or Administrator,
6 Assistant to the Executive Director or Administrator, Directors of
7 departments having charge of personnel, labor relations, civil
8 rights or public relations, and all Attorneys-at-Law, who have held
9 his or her office or position, including any promotion or realloca-
10 tion therefrom within the Authority for a total period of five years
11 of uninterrupted service, shall be involuntarily separated there-
12 from except subject to and in accordance with the provisions of
13 Sections 41 to 45, inclusive, of said Chapter 31 to the same extent as
14 if said office or position were classified under said chapter.
