AN ACT RELATIVE TO SALES TAX.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section six of chapter 64H, as most recently amended by chapter
2 796 of the acts of 1979, is hereby further amended by adding after
3 clause hh the following clause: —

4 Clause gg. The one time purchase of a non-commercial passen-
5 ger vehicle with a fuel capacity of not more than twenty-five
6 gallons, by a legal resident of the commonwealth who has attained
7 his sixty-fifth birthday by January 1, 1981.
