AN ACT DEFINING THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE STATE RECLAMATION BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 2 of chapter 252 of the General Laws as most recently
2 amended by chapter 641 of the acts of 1977 is hereby amended by
3 striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the
4 following sentence: — One employee of the department of environ-
5 mental quality engineering designated by its commissioner, one
6 employee of the department of food and agriculture designated by
7 its commissioner, and one employee of the department of environ-
8 mental management designated by its commissioner, shall consti-
9 tute the state reclamation and mosquito control board in this
10 chapter called the board.
