### AN ACT RELATING TO THE SUPPORT OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 34 of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as most recently
- 2 amended by section 7 of the initiative approved by the people on
- 3 November 4, 1980 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 4 Notwithstanding any contrary provision of any special or gener-
- 5 al law, including any provision of any city charter, every city and
- 6 town shall annually provide an amount of money sufficient for the
- 7 support of the public schools as required by this chapter, provided
- 8 however, that no city or town shall be required to provide more
- 9 money for the support of the public schools than is appropriated
- 10 by vote of the legislative body of the city or town in accordance
- 11 with its charter or other law applicable thereto.

It is the duty of the House to see that the laws are faithfully executed and that the public money is properly expended.
