AN ACT INCREASING INCOME TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR THE ELDERLY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Clause (C) of subparagraph (1) of subdivision (b)
2 of subsection B of section 3 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as
3 appearing in section 2 of chapter 723 of the acts of 1973, is hereby
4 amended by striking out the words "six hundred" and inserting in
5 place thereof the following words: — two thousand.

1 SECTION 2. Clause (C) of subparagraph (2) of said subdivi-
2 sion B of said section 3 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as so
3 appearing, is hereby amended by striking out the words "six
4 hundred" and inserting in place thereof the following words: —
5 two thousand.

Chapter 1043 of the Laws of 1914

AN ACT TO AMEND THE UNIVERSITY OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of New York on the 10th day of March, 1914.

SECTION 1. Chapter 1043 of the Laws of 1914 is amended by adding to it section 1043.1 of the Laws of 1914, to read as follows:

1043.1. The University of the State of New York shall have the honor and privilege of conferring the degree of Doctor of Laws upon such persons as may be recommended by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of New York.

SECTION 2. Chapter 1043 of the Laws of 1914 is amended by adding to it section 1043.2 of the Laws of 1914, to read as follows:

1043.2. The University of the State of New York shall have the honor and privilege of conferring the degree of Doctor of Letters upon such persons as may be recommended by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of New York.
