AN ACT DESIGNATING THE PLAYGROUND ON MYSTIC VALLEY PARKWAY  
IN ARLINGTON AS THE WILLIAM R. MACDONALD PLAYGROUND.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 2 Arlington shall be designated and known as the William R. Mac-
- 3 Donald playground, in memory of William R. MacDonald of that
- 4 town and a suitable marker bearing said designation shall be
- 5 attached thereto by the metropolitan district commission.

1. The Government of the United States is the only one in the world which is based on the consent of the governed.
2. All powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, or prohibited to the States by the States, are reserved to the States or to the people.
3. The Government shall not grant titles of nobility.
4. The Government shall not enter into any treaty, alliance, or confederation.
5. The Government shall not borrow money on the public credit.
6. The Government shall not issue paper money.
7. The Government shall not make any law which shall ex post facto laws, or which shall impair the obligation of contracts.
8. The Government shall not violate the right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures.
9. The Government shall not deprive any person of life, liberty, or property without due process of law.
10. The Government shall not deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.
