### **AN ACT PROHIBITING PARKING AND THE GATHERING OF GROUPS ALONG A CERTAIN PORTION OF THE REVERE BEACH BOULEVARD.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby authorized and  
2 directed to prohibit the parking of vehicles and the gathering of  
3 groups of people along the Revere Beach Boulevard on the easterly  
4 or beach side of said boulevard from the north side of the pavilion  
5 located at the intersection of Oak Island street and said boulevard  
6 northerly to the Carey circle between the hour of 11:00 P. M. to 6:00  
7 A.M. daily.
