**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO SPECIAL EDUCATION AND RELATED EXPENSES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of Chapter 71B of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by inserting the following in the appropriate  
3 alphabetical order:

4 "Human services agencies", the departments of public health,  
5 mental health, youth services, social services, public welfare, and  
6 the office for children, rehabilitation commission, commission for  
7 the blind, and rate setting commission;

8 "Related services", services designed to develop the educational  
9 potential of children with special needs including but not limited to  
10 those of a medical, psychological, therapeutic, rehabilitative and  
11 occupational nature.

1 SECTION 2. Section 5 of Chapter 71B of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

3 Upon consultation with the human services agencies, the depart-  
4 ment shall regularly notify the school committees of all cities,  
5 towns, or school districts, of the services relevant to the implemen-  
6 tation of this chapter, provided by or funded through the state or  
7 the federal government. No school committee shall be required to  
8 provide or pay for "related services" as defined by section one.
