**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO JUVENILE OFFENDERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 119 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking  
2 out section fifty-three and inserting in place thereof the follow-  
3 ing: —

4 *Section 53.* Sections fifty-two to sixty-three inclusive shall be  
5 construed to effectuate the following purposes:

6 (a) Preserve and strenghten the juvenile's family ties whenever  
7 possible, removing him from the custody of his parents only when  
8 his safety and the protection of the public cannot be adequately  
9 safeguarded without such removal;

10 (b) Provide the necessary treatment, care, custody and disci-  
11 pline for juveniles before the court which will best serve the emo-  
12 tional, mental, and physical welfare of the child;

13 (c) Make the violent or serious juvenile offender accountable  
14 for his behavior;

15 (d) Provide for punishment consistent with the age, act, and  
16 behavior of the juvenile offender; and

17 (e) Protect the citizenry from delinquent and criminal behavior.

18 Proceedings against juveniles under said sections shall not be  
19 deemed criminal proceedings.

The first part of the report deals with the general situation in the country.
