### AN ACT RELATIVE TO RELOCATION INSURANCE FOR CERTAIN TENANTS DISPLACED DUE TO FIRE LOSS.

1     *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to  
2 defeat its purpose, which is relative to relocation insurance for  
3 certain tenants displaced due to fire loss, therefore it is hereby  
4 declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate  
5 preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General  
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1     SECTION 1. The insurance commission shall promulgate rules  
2 and regulations for the implementation of clause Fifteenth of  
3 section ninety-nine of chapter one hundred and seventy-five of the  
4 General Laws.

1     SECTION 2. The insurance commissioner shall promulgate  
2 the rules and regulations provided for in section one of this act  
3 within ninety days of the effective date of this act.

1. The House of Representatives is the lower branch of the national legislature. It is elected by the people of each State and the District of Columbia. Its members are elected for two years, and one-half of the members are elected every second year.

2. The House of Representatives has the sole power of impeachment. It has the power to impeach and to try all civil officers of the United States, and all judges of the United States.

3. The House of Representatives has the power to originate bills for the raising of revenue, and to originate bills for the appropriation of money. It has the power to originate bills for the regulation of commerce and navigation, and for the regulation of the postal service.

4. The House of Representatives has the power to originate bills for the declaration of war, and for the raising and supporting of armies. It has the power to originate bills for the raising and supporting of a navy, and for the regulation of the military and naval service.
