AN ACT TO REQUIRE THREE JUSTICES IN THE FIRST DISTRICT COURT OF SOUTHERN MIDDLESEX.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6 of Chapter 218 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the words in the first paragraph
3 following the word Middlesex "and the first district court of south-
4 ern Middlesex."

1 SECTION 2. Section 6 of Chapter 218 of the General Laws is
2 hereby further amended by adding in the first paragraph the words
3 "and the first district court of southern Middlesex" following the
4 words, central district court of Worcester.
