AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF BUSINESS ON SUNDAY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of chapter 136 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by chapter 296 of the Acts of 1979, is hereby further
3 amended by striking subsection (9) thereof and inserting the fol-
4 lowing subsection: —

5 (9) The showing, sale, or rental of non-commercial real prop-
6 erty to be used for residential purposes.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I

Section 1

1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

3. No Representative shall have been three Years next preceding his Election in the United States; and when elected he shall, before he enters on the Office, be seven Years of Age at least.

4. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
