## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE FINGERPRINTING AND PHOTOGRAPHING OF CRIMINAL DEFENDANTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 263 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
- 2 out Section 1A as most recently amended by Chapter 217 of the
- 3 Acts of 1972 and inserting in place thereof the following section: —
- 4 *Section 59A. Fingerprinting and Photographing*
- 5 Whoever is arrested by virtue of process or is taken into custody
- 6 by an officer or is to appear before the Court pursuant to a
- 7 summons issued upon a warrant or complaint and charged with the
- 8 commission of a felony shall be fingerprinted, according to the
- 9 system of the bureau of identification in the department of public
- 10 safety, and may be photographed. Two copies of such fingerprints
- 11 and photographs shall be forwarded within a reasonable time to
- 12 the Commissioner of Public Safety.
