**AN ACT TO INCLUDE ORGANIZED LABOR REPRESENTATION ON THE
BOARD OF REGENTS.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 15A of the General Laws as amended by Chap-
2 ter 329 of the Acts of 1980 is amended in section two by
3 striking out the first sentence of the first paragraph and
4 substituting the following sentence: — “The board of regents
5 of higher education, hereinafter referred to as the board of
6 regents, shall consist of fifteen (15) members appointed by
7 the Governor including representatives from organized labor”.
