**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE QUALIFICATIONS OF BARBER INSTRUCTORS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 878 of Chapter 112 of the General Laws as last  
2 amended by Section 1 of Chapter 510 of the Acts of 1963 is  
3 hereby further amended by striking the last paragraph and  
4 inserting in place thereof the following: —

5 No person shall act as an instructor until he shall have  
6 passed an examination conducted by the Board and obtained a  
7 certificate of registration from said board. Each applicant for  
8 registration as an instructor shall furnish the Board with satis-  
9 fying proof that he possesses the educational qualities required  
10 for graduation from high school. Any person who furnishes  
11 the Board with satisfactory proof that he has served two  
12 years as an apprentice barber and one year as a master barber  
13 in a barber school shall upon payment of an examination fee  
14 of fifty dollars be entitled to be examined as set forth under  
15 the provisions of section eighty-seven G.

16 Any person who furnishes the board with satisfactory proof  
17 that he has a master barber license shall upon completion of  
18 one year in a barber school shall upon payment of an examina-  
19 tion fee of fifty dollars be entitled to be examined as set forth  
20 under the provisions of section eighty-seven G. Any person  
21 who furnishes the board with satisfactory proof that he has  
22 been a practicing registered barber for the five years im-  
23 mediately preceding the date of application shall upon pay-  
24 ment of an examination fee of fifty dollars, be entitled to be  
25 examined as set forth under the provisions of section eighty-

26 seven G. All persons found by the Board to be qualified, shall  
27 be registered by it as an instructor, and receive a certificate  
28 thereof signed by the Chairman and Secretary of the Board.  
29 Each certificate shall expire on December thirty-first next suc-  
30 ceeding its date. The Board may renew any such registration,  
31 and issue a certificate thereof, upon the payment of an annual  
32 renewal fee of twenty-five dollars.
