In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-three.

AN ACT TO PREVENT UNNECESSARY AND PAINFUL EXPERIMENTS ON ANIMALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 49A is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
2 Section 11 as follows:

3 *Section 11.* Any provision of law to the contrary notwith-
4 standing, no animal shall be subjected to any scientific investi-
5 gation, experimentation, or use for medical school or other
6 instruction, or testing of drugs or medicine, if alternative
7 methods are available, or the knowledge sought to be gained
8 is available from other scientific data, or the experiment is
9 repetitive, or designed for demonstrative purposes.

10 Any person or institution violating the provisions of this
11 section shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$5,000, and
12 shall suffer loss of any license granted by the Commonwealth
13 of Massachusetts to said institution for a period of six (6)
14 months.
