By Mr. MacLean, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1310) of William Q. MacLean, Jr., and John Medeiros for legislation to exempt operators of certain vehicle inspection stations from the required purchase of certain equipment. Public Safety.

AN ACT EXEMPTING OPERATORS OF CERTAIN VEHICLE INSPECTION STATIONS FROM THE REQUIRED PURCHASE OF CERTAIN EQUIPMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any other general or
2 special law to the contrary, the owners of vehicle inspection
3 facilities which are designated as private inspection stations,
4 so-called, by the registrar of motor vehicles and whose vehicles
5 which are to be inspected therein are exempt from exhaust
6 emission testing, shall not be required to own, operate or install
7 equipment used for the purpose of exhaust emission testing.
