AN ACT RELATIVE TO REVERTING TO OPTION "A" UPON THE DEATH
OF A SPOUSE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 32 of the Gen-
2 eral Laws, or any other general or special law to the contrary,
3 any police officer who retired under Option C, of the retire-
4 ment laws, in order to ensure a pension for his spouse, may,
5 if such spouse should predecease him, or within five years
6 after his retirement, upon his request, revert to Option A of
7 the retirement laws.
